Adult Sunday school classes

Issues of Faith [session two of seven] facilitated by our Faith in Action commission to discuss the primary challenges for families seeking to thrive in Indiana. *Faith in Indiana (formerly IndyCan)* is a helpful network to help us engage in issues impacting our community. Today we are discussing Pre-K for All.

Upcoming class sessions are: Ending Gun Violence (April 22), Jobs for All (April 29), Ending Mass Deportation (May 6), Ending Mass Incarceration (May 13), Healthcare for All (May 20). This class will use multiple speakers to empower us to do this and identify next steps in our faithfulness. Meets in the multi-purpose room.

Reading From the Margins: Suffering and Hope . Faithfulness and Justice. (Second session of four). Ben Tapper is leading discussions using recent articles he has written for *The Mennonite and Christianity Now*. The articles capture these theological tensions and are the platform for discussion of how we engage and discern God's invitation. Today's class will be *No More Martyrs*. Meets in the Wisdom room.

Everence stewardship class: THE IMPACT OF OUR GIVING DECISIONS: While our intentions for giving are for good, there can be unintended negative effects, as well. How can we faithfully follow God's call to be a good neighbor to those around us? STEWARDS OF GRACE: We will examine the stewardship of time, talents, health, money, creation care and relationships.
